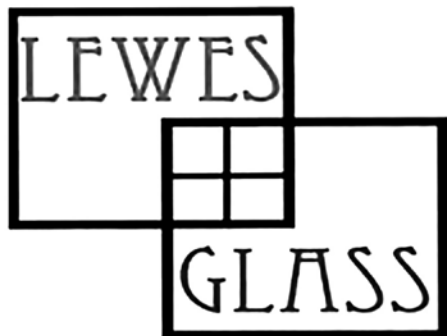

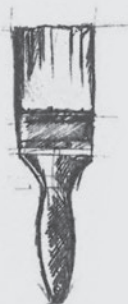

ST MARY'S ECO TIP – ENERGY PRICES

It can seem very confusing that, as more energy than ever is produced from reusable solar and wind power in the UK and less and less from UK North Sea oil and gas supplies, that electricity prices are much higher than gas.

In the UK, the electricity pricing system is coupled with the price of gas for electricity produced by the gas power station industry. They are run for profit and directly affected by the fluctuations of the world gas market, vulnerable to wars, pandemics and supplies.

There is a move to decouple the electricity pricing system from the marginal gas price, for the benefit of the public. This would make energy bills lower and more stable as the country works to meet the effects of climate change, including reducing energy made directly and indirectly from gas. It is a complex pricing/tax/incentive/levies system that needs addressing and also needs to ensure major infrastructure improvements are in place as we transition to a clean energy future. There are petitions that can be signed and MPs to be contacted to make concerns known. As world leaders and climate justice campaigners returned from Brazil for the UN climate talks COP30, it is worth catching and inspiring new film about how to turn our homes and streets into renewable power stations. The film is called 'Power Station' and is about two artists in Walthamstow, who set out to take their street off the grid, kickstarting a solar powered energy revolution. 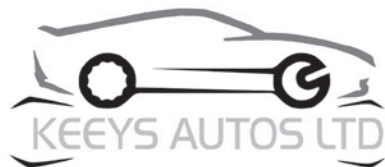

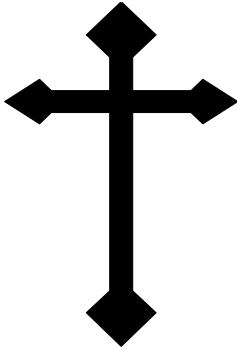

WHAT'S ON IN RINGMER



RINGMER WI UPDATE

On a dark, wet December evening we were delighted that 39 members turned out to our Christmas meeting. In a fascinating, entertaining and uplifting presentation, Andy Thomas covered the long and intriguing background to the festive season. From ancient midwinter celebrations of light to the marking of the birth of a Messiah, mid-December has long been a time for rituals and rejoicing by many cultures and civilisations.

Yet the history of Christmas has not been straightforward. Its celebration was banned in Puritan times and its merry traditions splintered into many guises before the Victorians rehabilitated the festival into what it has become today. Andy showed how, for all the commercialisation, we can still find meaning and enjoy Christmas today while keeping the flame of light alive in the winter darkness. After the talk, mulled wine and Christmas festive bites were served, an excellent start to the Christmas period.

Our next meeting will be on Tuesday 6 January when Peter Allen will talk about the history of television crime fighters. He will walk us through the quiet of St Mary Mead, the golden spires of Oxford, the cliffs of Broadchurch and the killing fields of Midsummer. On the way he will unearth clues that reveal how our fascination with the long arm of the law owes much to the uncertainty, experimentation and innovation of the early days of television.

Visitors are welcome to attend two meetings a year, after which we very much hope you will join.

LEWES DISTRICT COUNCIL LOCAL PLAN

At the LDC cabinet meeting on 11th December it was agreed to put the Lewes Local Plan out for consultation. Although some minor changes were agreed the plan essentially doubles the size of Ringmer village and Broyleside. The plan does not include a firm commitment to or proper planning for the required infrastructure to cater for the increased population.

The Parish Council will keep you updated on the consultation and how to respond.

In addition, the LDC Cabinet agreed a proposal by Cllr. O'Brien to loan Ovesco £500,000 to allow continuing development of the Norlington Lane solar farm.

COMMUNITY INFRASTRUCTURE LEVY (CIL) FUND

The Parish Council has identified certain projects that might be carried out using CIL funds to improve village infrastructure. These are: a new cricket pavilion, refurbishing the Scout Hut, Ringmer Village Hall Phase 2 – to create additional meeting space and youth provision infrastructure. The Parish Council will consult with residents through the Ringmer Neighbourhood Plan review.

PARISH COUNCIL BUDGET 2026/27

At the December meeting of the Parish Council, the budget and precept for the next financial year was agreed at £166,635 (£161,550 (25/26)). This represents an increase of 3.15%, which for a Band D property amounts to £76.21 per household; an overall increase of £1.64 per household.

A FEW PLANS FOR 2026

A Project Manager has been appointed to oversee the Springett Avenue Shopping Precinct project. Following the signing of the agreement, the tendering process will commence.

Moving to thoughts of the summer.... preparations for the 'Picnic on the Green' event, set for the August Bank Holiday on 31 August 2026, will soon begin – don't forget to pop the date in your diary.

Following the acceptance of a quote by the Parish Council in December, a new footpath entrance from The Broyle to the Skatepark on Fingerpost Field will be created – early 2026.

RINGMER LOCAL PLAN CONSULTATION ALERT

Councillor Emily O'Brien says: "By the time this magazine is printed a crucial local plan consultation for Ringmer should be under way – please do have your say. A Local Plan sets out where future development will take place, such as new homes, schools, transport, community facilities and locations for business growth, as

well as the planning rules against which future planning applications will be judged.

"This is the fourth consultation on the developing The Lewes District Local Plan, it takes over six years to get to a Local Plan with many different hoops to jump through. This stage is key however, as it shows where housing is proposed and there is a lot of housing proposed for Ringmer and even if you have responded before we'd urge you have your say.

"As local councillors we have concerns not just at the amount of housing, but that although there is a clear commitment to any housing coming with the 'infrastructure' needed – shops, community space, cycle way, GP surgery, primary school – the detailed planning for what's most important and where it should go hasn't yet taken place. You may also have other ideas about what's needed, for example, perhaps traffic calming and a 20mph limit for the main road?

"As your local councillors, we have met with council officers who have advised this detailed 'infrastructure' planning is very much part of the next stage – so please do go along to one of the in-person events that council officers will be running, or respond online and share your thought not just on the volume and location of housing, but the facilities needed locally to go with any development, especially as some of the sites included in the draft local plan have also separately applied for planning permission – so they are in the system regardless of what happens around the Local Plan.

"We know that the Local Plan is of particular concern to all of us and our residents in Ringmer. Johnny, Lucy and I wrote to parish councillors last week. I have met with officers to seek reassurance over the next stage ensuring meaning provision of infrastructure, and I understand that Ringmer PC raised similar concerns at the meeting the same day. I also last week attended the meeting of local campaign group RAGE as a ward councillor, to hear their concerns, and I'm pleased to say the LDC Cabinet Member for planning today confirmed officers are looking at how best to incorporate both the requests they made. For example, adding an additional table plus clarity over the need for and commitment to the appropriate infrastructure (i.e. not housing in isolation) as part of consultation materials. I'll be doing all I can to encourage people to respond, do let ward councillors know of any opportunities to support engagement that the Parish Council is leading."

RINGMER AGAINST GREENFIELD EXPLOITATION



Ringmer Against Greenfield Exploitation

A RAGE
representative
writes: "Lewes
District
Council's Cabinet
voted to approve for

consultation a new draft Local Plan that is very bad news indeed for Ringmer. The details were carefully hidden, but their plan is to more than double the present number of houses in Ringmer, to create a new town here that would be as big as Newhaven.

"In addition to the housing sites already approved, the new plan proposes over 1,000 more homes on the fields between Bishops Lane, Norlington Lane and Broyle Lane, and several hundred more to the east of Broyleside, going as far as Half Mile Drove. They even propose another field of houses between the Primary School and Harrisons Lane - completely ignoring the fact that if that is available, it would obviously be needed to expand the primary school to cope with all the new children.

"While the new plan is claimed to be "Vision-led and transport-driven", in reality there is not the slightest sign of any vision for the new Ringmer it would create. Assessing whether any new infrastructure might be needed is just a detail left for later. The exact opposite of proper planning!

"The Cabinet that unanimously approved these proposals included two of our ward councillors, Cllrs Johnny Denis & Emily O'Brien. To add insult to injury Cllr O'Brien also proposed, and the Cabinet agreed, that the council should lend another £500,000 to OVESCO so that they can carry forward their plans for their huge new solar farm on the top quality farmland between Norlington Lane and the Uckfield Road. 'Consultation' on these devastating proposals will take place during January and February 2026. Lewes DC have not as yet arranged any consultation events in Ringmer."
